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"Our dream was for the gems of chamber music to resonate in an intimate setting that the composers themselves might have envisioned at the time. A setting where the audience can more easily turn inward, transformed by walks in nature and the tranquil, nostalgic atmosphere of the hotel, evoking the peaceful vibrations of a bygone era.

The composers poured their deepest emotions into their chamber works, and because these pieces were written for small ensembles, the highest level of technical and artistic skill was expected of the musicians. Every instrument plays a soloistic role; there is no hierarchy, just a constant exchange of brilliant ideas and burning, ongoing communication.

And while these programs can thrive in larger concert halls, they truly make their greatest impact in environments where the audience becomes a kind of community and participates almost interactively through the intensity of their listening and attention.
