for violinists under 22 17-19 November, 2023 Budapest (Hungary)

Competition Call 2023

The Festival Academy Budapest is holding a competition from 19 to 19 November, 2023 for violinists under 22, in four age groups and two rounds.

I. THE COMPETITION

The Jenő Hubay Violin Competition was founded in 2020 by Katalin Kokas and Barnabás Kelemen for the youngest generation of violinists in Central and Eastern Europe, under the age of twenty. The competition is open for violinists under the age of 22 from the countries neighbouring Hungary and the Visegrad Four. The competition is divided into four age groups, with one round for age group 1 and two rounds for the other three age groups. The jury will include a distinguished violinist or violin teacher from each country in the region. The violin competition is the "precursor" to the biennial Ilona Fehér International Violin Competition. The finalists of the Hubay Competition will receive an automatic invitation to the V. Ilona Fehér Violin Competition in July 2024.

IV. PRIZES

Total prize money for the competition €5 500.

The jury will award a grand prize of €4000 to one participant of the competition, regardless of age group. Special prizes of € 1500, concert appearances and contributions will be awarded. The winners will be admitted free of charge to the V Ilona Fehér International Violin Competition.

Special prizes of € 300 will be awarded to the teachers of the category winners, and the teacher who brings the most students to the competition.

Participants in the competition will receive a 25% discount on the Festival Academy Budapest 2024 summer masterclasses.

17-19 November 2023	Competition in one round for age group 1, in two rounds for age groups 2, 3, 4
19 November 2023	Awards ceremony and gala concert (attendance is compulsory for all finalists)

The competition program should be submitted as part of the registration, but changes in the program can be made by 20 October, 2023

AGE GROUP 4 FIRST ROUND

(max. 25 min)

Program:

A freely chosen piece from Niccolò Paganini's 24 Caprices

AND

Three freely chosen Bartók-duos from different characters (upper violin solo)

AND

A freely chosen movement from one of the following sonatas

- Ludwig van Beethoven: Violin Sonata No. 3 in E flat major, Op. 12, No. 3
- Ludwig van Beethoven: Violin Sonata in A major, Op. 12, No. 2
- Ludwig van Beethoven: Violin Sonata No. 8 in G major, Op. 30, No. 3

AND

One freely chosen first or last (but not slow) movement from a Romantic concerto.

SECOND ROUND

Program:

One or two movements from a solo sonata/partita by J. S. Bach

AND

Freely chosen first or second and third movement from a concerto from the list below

- Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart: Violin Concerto No. 1 in B flat major (K. 207)
- Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart: Violin Concerto No. 2 in D major (K. 211)
- Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart: Violin Concerto No. 2 in G major (K. 216)
- Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart: Violin Concerto No. 4 in D major (K. 218)
- Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart: Violin Concerto No. 5 in A major (K. 219)



VII. CONDITIONS FOR APPLICATION

- The competition is open for citizens of Hungary, Austria, Slovakia, Ukraine, Romania, Serbia, Croatia, Slovenia, Czech Republic, Poland and students who are active students at a music school in one of the countries listed.
- Competitors can only compete in the age group corresponding to their date of birth.
- Application is subject to payment of the entry fee
- The maximum number of competitors is 50. The list of participants and the exact timetable of the rounds for each age group will be published on 20 October 2023.
- Proof of active student status must be scanned and sent to <u>competition@festivalacademy.org</u> no later than 20 October 2023
- The deadline for arrival and personal registration is 17 November 2023 (by 2 p.m.)
 The order of the competitors will be drawn at the opening ceremony on 16
 November 2023, the youngest competitor in each age group drawn.
- The competition programme should preferably be learnt from a new Urtext score.
 The scores of freely chosen works must be sent in scanned form to the organisers by 20 October 2023 to competition@festivalacademy.org. Piano accompanists may only play from the original, legally clean score, which must be presented at the time of personal registration.
- If requested, the organisers will provide a piano accompanist for the entire duration of the competition for a fee of 10,000 HUF (or 25 Euro), which includes one rehearsal per round and the competition production. The organisers can only meet requests for piano accompanists paid together with the application fee.
- Piano rehearsals will be available on 17 November 2023 in the morning.
- Competitors are required to check in at the registration desk before each round and before each piano rehearsal.

VIII. APPLICATION PROCESS

Competitors must fill out, online via the website of the Festival Academy (https://fesztivalakademia.hu/en/jeno-hubay-violin-competition/) a Competition Application Form in its entirety and submit it. The Application Form is available from 25 February 2023.

- 3. A photo of the applicant (min. 600 dpi)
- 4. Whole program of the applicant
- 5. Confirmation of payment of the application fee
